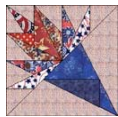
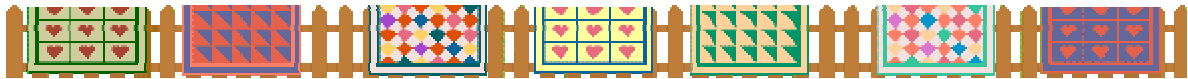

I have always enjoyed paper-piecing with paper-piecing patterns but had not considered the possibilities of drafting non-paper-piecing patterns out. I will probably be less hesitant to try it in the future. I don't think that anyone will forget about Sullivan's Basting Spray (“in the PINK CAN”) as I saw everyone grabbing their pens to write it down!

I also want to say thank you to our vendor – Brenda Esslinger from My Sister's Quilt in Edmond. It's been awhile since we've had My Sister's Quilt vending for us and it was nice that she was squeezing us in before the shop hop in June. Thank you to everyone that made purchases and supported our volunteer vendor.
