For those of you who missed the workshop and meeting this month, you missed a great opportunity to see the great diversity that is found in quilting. Our presenter, RaNae Merrill, began quilting in 1989 - finishing a king sized quilt left to her by her grandmother. Talk about jumping in at the deep end of the pool! She later began using her photography to help with inspiration in designing her own style of quilt.

RaNae showed us how to design and sew our own spirals. As RaNae explained to us, she uses these spirals to create spiral mandala quilts. Mandala designs are often circular, and can be quite intricate. RaNae believes that these designs are special because they carry a form of spiritual significance to the maker that can transcend to the viewer. Her quilts are a beautiful combination of shapes and colors. I especially loved the Easter lily quilt. I trust that you all enjoyed RaNae's presentation as much as I did!

REMINDER: The last VP challenge of the year is to create a holiday quilt. It can be ANY holiday for the year...Christmas, Easter, St. Patrick's Day, ... you might even consider a theme based on Flag Day, Talk Like a Pirate Day, or Columbus Day. As I mentioned at the meeting, there are 35 holidays between now and New Year's Eve. Dare to let a holiday not normally celebrated be your inspiration! These challenge quilts can be any size, shape, color or design. Please just have fun with making them! If you want to make placemats or other sized quilts for Loving Touch, that would be wonderful as well. We will show each other our creations at the November meeting. We had 6 people join or rejoin our guild at the August meeting. That puts our current membership at 159 quilt lovers.

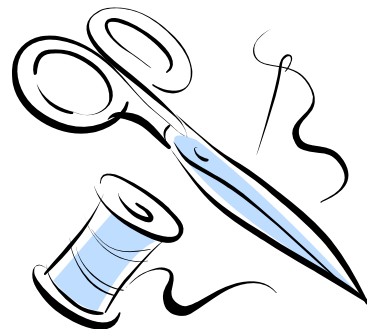

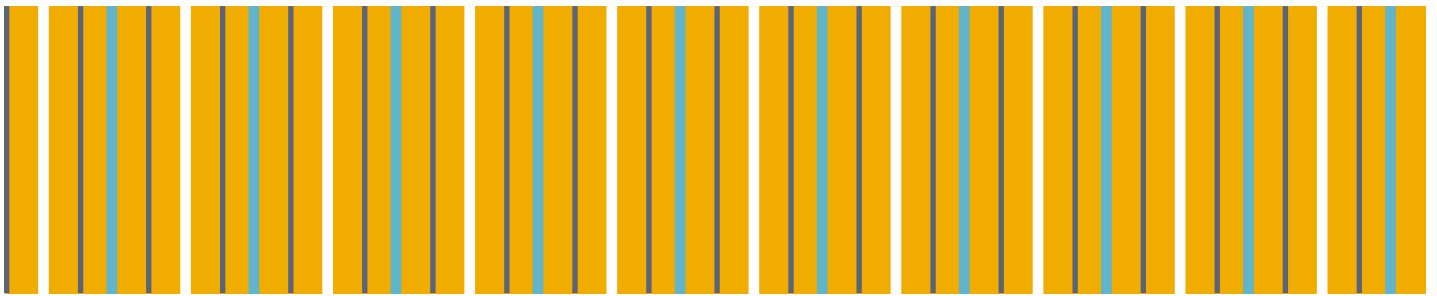
