

EQG BLOCK LOTTERY #8

Turn in at APRIL 21, 2009 Meeting

The eighth block exchange will be "Sunbonnet Sue". This appliqué design is based on Nancy Cabot's Sunbonnet Suzie from 1940.

Block Size:

9 1/2 x 9 1/2 inches unfinished, 9 x 9 inches finished.

Fabric needs:

Background--off white or creme color.

Bonnet and Dress--a fabric that you know Sue would like. *

Hand--flesh fabric

Shoes--Black, brown or whatever goes best with Sue's ensemble.

*Suggest bonnet #5 & sleeve #4 be the same fabric and dress #2 & hatband #6 be the same fabric.



Cutting:

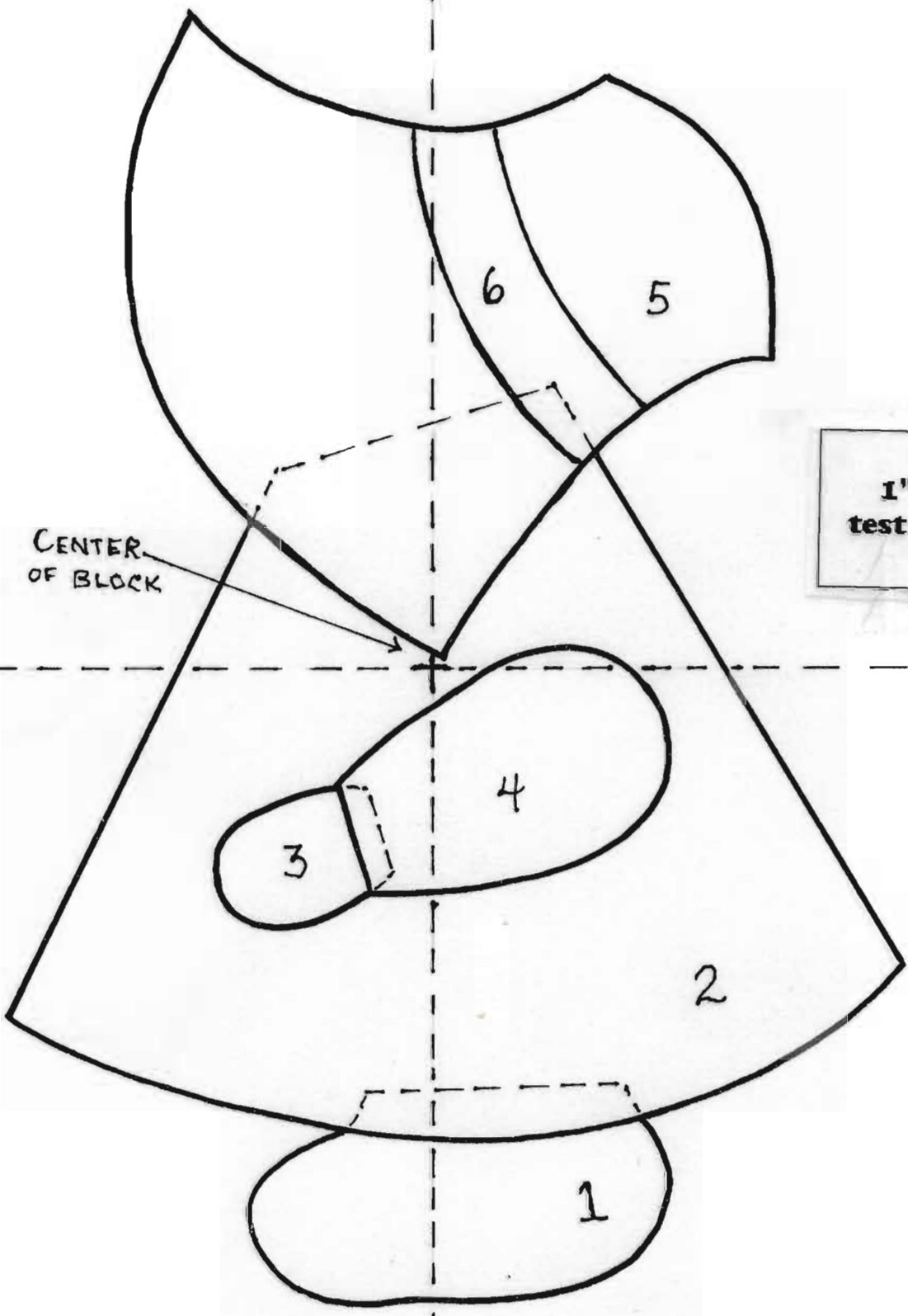
Cut one 9 1/2 inch square for the background. HINT: You can cut a larger square and then trim it down to 9 1/2 inches once your appliqué is complete. This helps make all those corners square and allows for any fabric taken up with your chosen method of appliqué.

From fabrics:

1. Cut the background square.
2. Cut out appliqué pieces 1 through 6 with your chosen fabrics.
 - a. Cut as is, if you are doing machine appliqué.
 - b. Add 1/8" to 1/4" all around each piece if you are doing hand appliqué.
3. If tracing paper template on back of fabric, be sure to reverse the template.
4. Determine center of your block for placement of Sue.
5. Apply pieces to background starting with #1, then #2 etc. using the appliqué method of your choice.

If you have any problems or have questions, call Lee Gray or check with another quilting buddy for some assistance. Good luck and I hope you have fun with this one.

Remember you will receive a ticket for every Sunbonnet Sue block you enter in the lottery. At the April 21st meeting we will have a drawing to see who wins the blocks. We hope to have many entries so each winner would receive at least 12 blocks. That would be enough to make a nice crib quilt.
