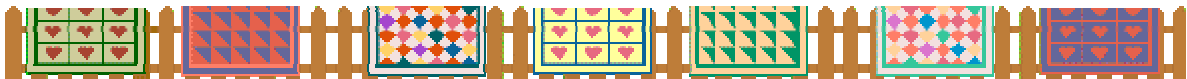

Wow! What a great week for guild activities. Thank you to Alice, Joan, and all the folks that helped make the arrangements. All your hard work paid off for the guild members.

Monday evening, we co-sponsored Michelle Watts who spoke at the Norman Area Quilt Guild. She was entertaining and informative. The quilts she brought along were beautiful. Her technique of “straight line zig-zag quilting” was so simplistic but quite spectacular on her southwestern inspired quilts. She brought along the first quilt she ever did to give hope to all of us that we too should aspire to great quilts! Hopefully the class she taught went really great. I was unable to attend but would expect it to have been fun and educational based on her lecture.

Tuesday night brought us Amy Stewart Winsor – another humorous and entertaining speaker. (I still don't see her being old enough for six kids!) I liked her concept of “just keep going” until your quilt becomes what you want. She led us through several of her quilts, start to finish to show how she “planned” her quilts, along with her techniques of woven fabric, placed piecing, free form curved piecing, and her fascination with yo's yo's and other embellishments. She also graced us with a wall quilt called “Flowers for the Children” – a bombing memorial 10th anniversary quilt she made in commemoration for the children of the bombing. She had just finished it so we were the first group to see it. What a special unexpected honor.

We had a special “quilt-mercial” this meeting from John Ramsey and his staff (which includes our own Cheryl Boles!). They brought and demonstrated the newest Bernina machine with the new stitch regulator. Wow! What's next for sewing machines? If I'm not mistaken, even Amy Stewart Winsor said she was picking up her Bernina when she returned home!

I also want to say thank you to our vendor – Su Bunch from Piece Keepers of Yukon. Su generally works with her husband but she did a great job on her own for us! She vends her fabrics and kits at guilds and shows; she also opens her home for individuals if they make an appointment with her. Lottery #5 – Heart Applique -is in conjunction with our May speaker, Linda Morton and instructions were passed around at the meeting. This should be a really fun lottery as you are free to make your heart however you want, just make it 6 ½ inches unfinished. Use whatever technique you would like and be as creative as you would like! We showed several samples from simple to more intricate and complex to give you ideas.
