Cards are ready (mistakes have been fixed-I hope). You may pick yours up at the next meeting unless you e-mail me and ask for it to be mailed.



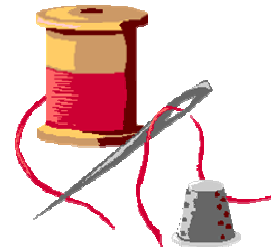

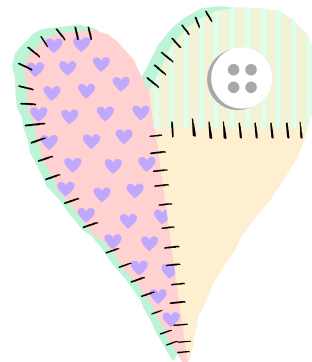
